Parque Fluvial 3 Ríos

It is developed on an important peninsula with an approximate area of 33,000 m² in the city of Culiacán, Sinaloa, in the area of "Tres Ríos". It is owned by the Federal Government (CONAGUA) and on loan to the State of Sinaloa. It is located under the Almada Bridge, adjacent to the Paseo Niños Héroes road.

The peninsula has a series of restrictions imposed by CONAGUA due to its floodplain category. This agency has a hydrological study that defines the hydraulic sections, river embankments, central and complementary channels of floodplains, as well as restrictions on the placement of elements for this type of space.

The need to develop a park on this peninsula is to take advantage of the potential of the existing elements (physical, structural, and landscaping) to generate dynamic spaces that can adapt to the hydraulic constraints that affect it, as well as promote contact with the rivers. Likewise, the almost inherent connections between Oraba Island and the banks of the Tamazula and Humaya rivers would be favored.

Therefore, in the park project design, the guiding design axis was the malecon with a length of 600 linear meters, which was placed around the perimeter of the peninsula. It has a vehicle and pedestrian access ramp, and pedestrian access was incorporated at both ends. This is to prevent difficulties in evacuating the facilities during a river flood.

Zone 1

Zone 2

Is made up of the children's play area and the sports area, which were placed exactly under the Almada Bridge road body to take advantage of the existing structures and anchor the games using a hoisting system that allows them to be raised during river floods to prevent them from being washed away. It has high-power LED lighting that provides greater security to users.

Zone 3

Is composed of a multipurpose green area or grassy esplanade for informal games with an approximate area of 9,500 m², where the placement of trees that generate shaded spaces and camping throughout the area is planned.

It has a parking lot for 146 vehicles, and the park's lighting is based on four 30-meter-high super-posts.

Since its inauguration, it has been very successful and is visited by families in the afternoons and evenings, mainly on weekends.
